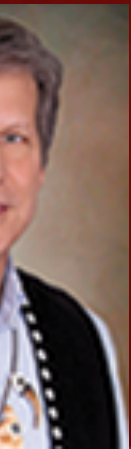

- **Central Council of the Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Central Council) is a federally-recognized tribe representing over 30,000 Tlingits and Haidas worldwide.**
- **Through a written Constitution, Central Council organized as a single regional tribal entity and gained federal recognition in 1935.**

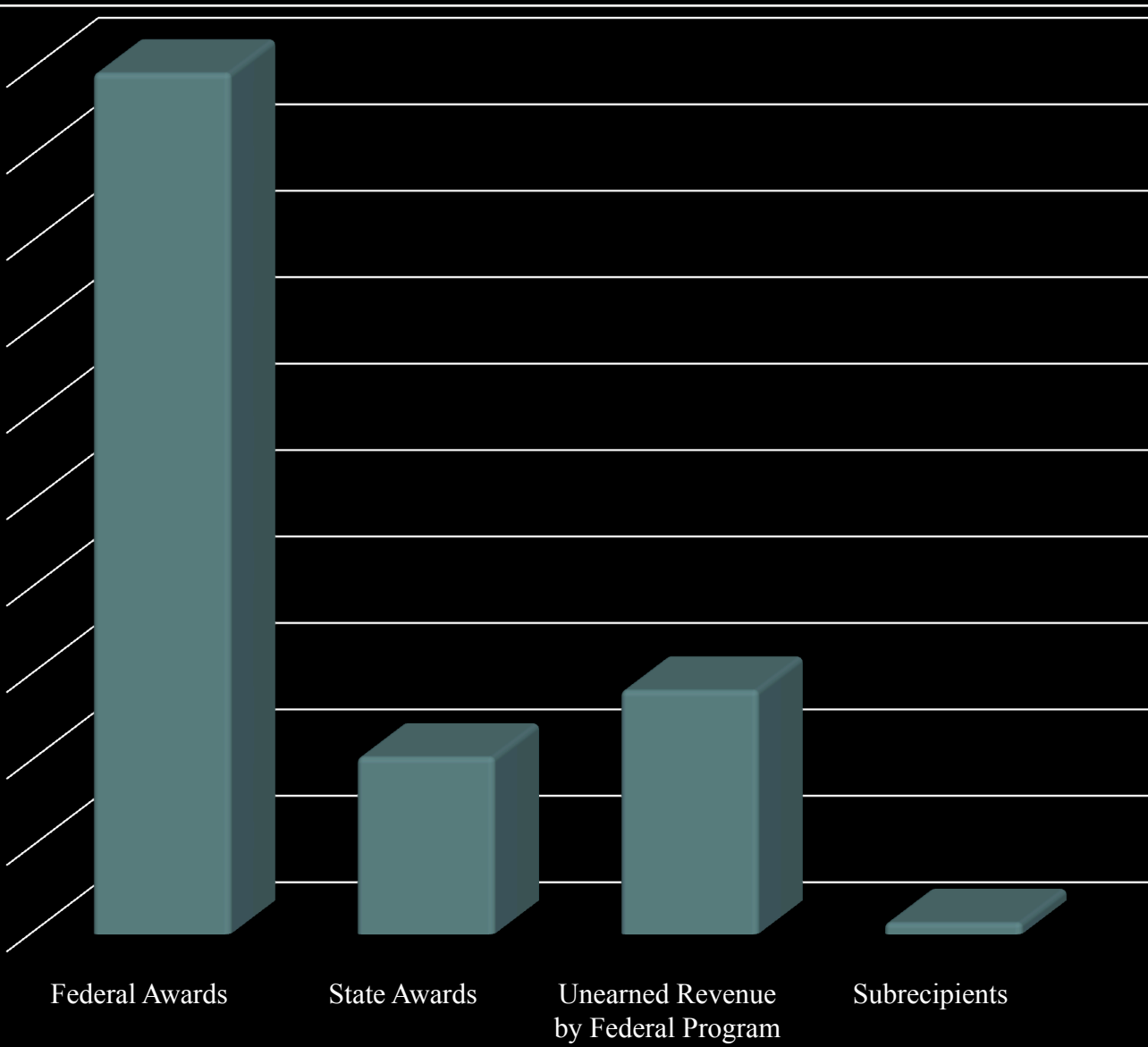

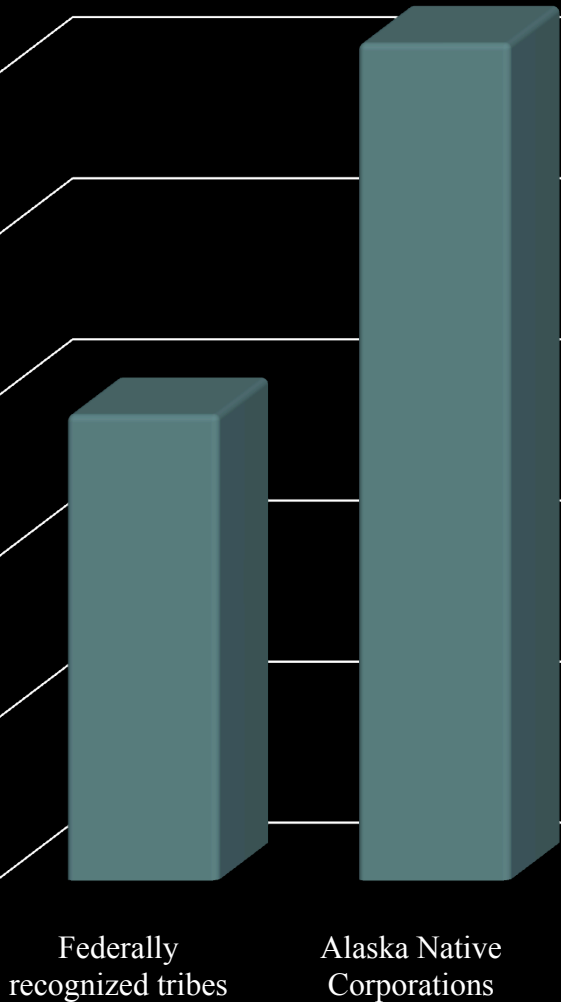
FUNDING
