- ❖ Publications: Alaska Taxable, Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy, Statewide Broadband

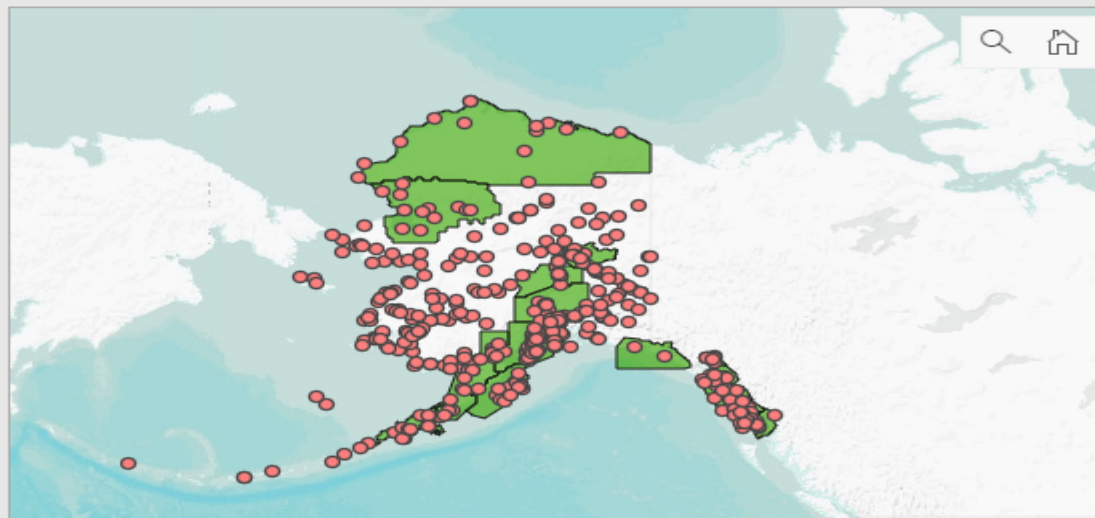
